



Bioterrorism Preparedness for Clinicians (EM 201)

THE NEED

This course is designed to prepare physicians and other clinicians for a bioterrorism event or other potential public health emergency. At the conclusion of the course, participants should be able to:

- ▼ Recognize mental health issues associated with bioterrorism events
